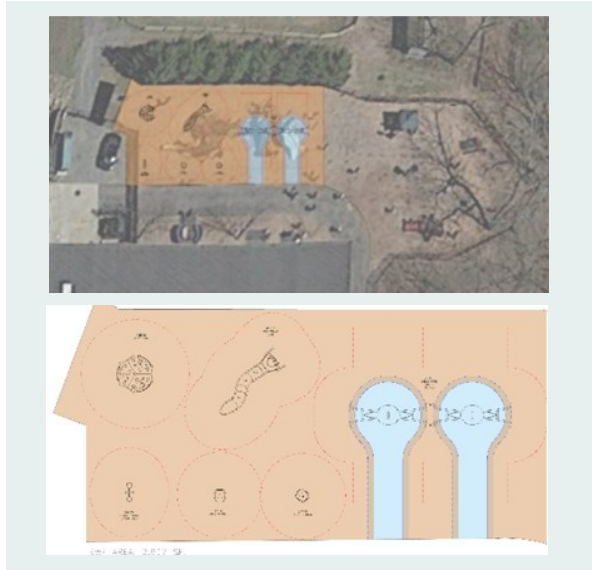

Built when League moved to Walpole in 1999, our current outdoor space was designed to serve a different student population. Today, the space is not only being used by more students than ever before, but also by students with a broader range of ages and abilities.



Teachers, staff, and professionals collaborated on a design that is appropriate and engaging for all of our students.

The space will include structures that provide health and physical benefits, while also fostering social interactions and encouraging play at all levels for our students.

A modular design offers flexibility for future additions based on the needs and profiles of our students.
