



Our Admission Process

Step 1: Referral Packet

The League School for Autism will first receive a referral packet from the student's local school district, state agency, or parent/guardian. This packet typically contains the student's IEP, recent testing, psychological reports, behavioral data, and more.

Step 2: Initial Intake Meeting

We will assess whether your child may benefit from League School for Autism programs. If we believe we're a good match for your student, we will schedule an initial intake meeting so you can meet our team and introduce your student to our school and staff.

Step 3: Paperwork Completion

Prior to admission, you will be required to fill out all necessary paperwork. Our Admissions Coordinator will then set a date for a full-day intake.

Step 4: Full-Day Intake

If, after the initial intake, League School for Autism appears to be a good fit for your child, they will spend a full day at the school and/or residential homes.

Step 5: Recommendation Review

Once both intakes have been completed, the League School's Admissions Team meets and a recommendation to accept or decline a candidate is reviewed.


Step 6: Program Admission

Once the candidate has been accepted and all paperwork completed, then an official admission date will be scheduled.
